From Where I Stand...

I saw it just a few days after returning to the city. There I was, officiating at a funeral for a dear one who had died during the Katrina evacuation, and I saw it, clear as day, as I recited the familiar words of Psalm 121.



*The Lord is thy keeper;
The Lord is thy shade upon thy right hand.
The sun shall not smite thee by day,
Nor the moon by night.
The Lord shall keep thee from all evil;
He shall keep thy soul.*

What did I see? I saw in the eyes of more than a few of those mourners a look of cynicism and an air of profound doubt. I realized that it was not unreasonable. After all, Hurricanes Katrina and Rita and their horrible consequences are sufficient to cause lifelong “believers” to wonder about God’s reliability and protectiveness. But here is the question to be asked:

What may we reasonably expect of God?

This year as we approach Chanukah, our beloved Festival of Lights, we have all the more reason to ponder what expectations the Maccabees had of God when they faced the disaster of their day. There is no indication that they stood by with folded hands wondering when and how the Rock of Ages would manage to defeat those tyrants who had stolen their Temple and seized their freedom of religious expression.

No, they did not engage in theological dialogue. The Maccabees took up arms and courageously defied the enemy majority to take back their House of Prayer and to manifest their undeterred faith in God. Chanukah arrives each year as a joyous reminder of how, in the midst of turmoil and trauma, our fathers and mothers stood firm and chose to die rather than doubt the saving Covenant of the Living God.

Now it is our turn to affirm the Jewish future and the crucial role you and I must assume in it. Fellow Maccabees, arm yourselves with faith amid the darkness that surrounds us. As we gather in all our generations, let us rededicate ourselves to kindle holy light, both in our hearts and in our city.

To each and every one of you, from our hearts to yours, across the city and across the nation, we send our heartiest best wishes for a gladsome and bright Chanukah 5766.

President's Message

Dear Friends,

I am writing this column the day before I leave to go to the Biennial. I will be carrying a Torah from Temple Sinai on my journey to Houston. The URJ has planned that the four Rabbis and four Presidents of the Reform Congregations of Greater New Orleans will walk on stage at the Wednesday night opening, each carrying a congregational Torah that will be used throughout the Biennial. How very thoughtful and appropriate for the URJ to shine a bright light on New Orleans at this most difficult time.



On Wednesday, there will be an announcement made that the Union is establishing a special campaign to raise at least \$250,000 in matching funds to help our four Reform congregations. As Director of the Jewish Endowment Foundation I am especially proud to say that our Jewish Community's Endowment has pledged the local \$250,000 that will be matched by URJ's fundraising. The JEF Board voted unanimously to provide matching challenge funds based on membership units for not just Reform but for all the denominations of our Jewish community. Whether it is Reform, Conservative, Orthodox or Chabad – every congregation will have the opportunity to use local JEF funds as leverage and match money to raise additional funds on a national level. Every congregation has been affected and needs help and the Jewish Endowment Foundation will be providing critical financial support to all of our synagogues on a matching basis.

What a proud moment for all of us...united in our effort to re-build, re-new and strengthen our Jewish community. I am honored to have played a part in presenting the plan which was enthusiastically endorsed by JEF's President Ellen Yellin and the Board.

I will keep you informed of any further developments as we move forward to secure our future.

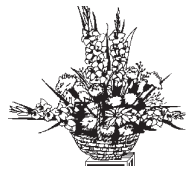

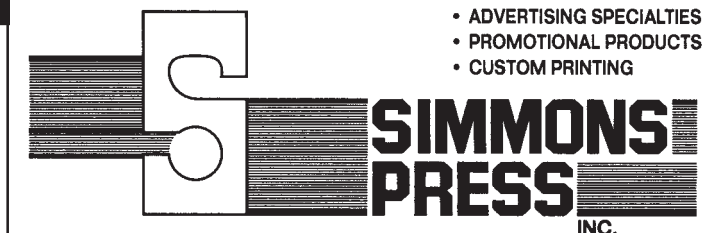
The Storm
